Since its origins in 1088, the University of Bologna has been student-centred hosting prominent figures from science and the arts.

Its teaching catalogue is diversified and tailored to the needs of present-day society and its degrees are widely recognized thanks to its international reputation: over 200 degree programmes among its 33 Departments and 11 Schools are offered to over 81,000 students. A further 5,000 graduates are enrolled in PhDs and 3rd cycle programmes. Of its international and joint-degree programmes, 33 are taught in English, moreover all the degree programmes offer the opportunity to spend some time studying abroad thanks to student exchange agreements with universities all over the world.

As a comprehensive research university Alma Mater has always invested in the multidisciplinary cross-cultural approach and in the inseparable connection between research and teaching. Bologna is one of the most active Universities leading and participating in European research and academic cooperation projects. The overseas branch in Buenos Aires coordinates research, post-graduate training and academic liaison with Latin America. Beyond its close European links, Bologna enjoys multiple international connections with North America, Africa, Asia and Australia ensuring a multicultural environment and support services to international students and faculty.

Buenos Aires Campus

The University of Bologna runs a Campus in Buenos Aires which offers interdisciplinary study programmes on different subjects. Some international degree programmes in the School of Economics, Management, and Statistics or in the School of Political Sciences offer the opportunity to take the full first year in Buenos Aires. Moreover students of the University of Bologna may take one full semester in the third year or shorter periods to prepare their final project.

Admissions Scholarships International Mobility

Admissions for international students

Access requirements, deadlines for application, admission methods, the number of places available and tuition fees vary depending on the degree programme and are published on the University Portal every year, starting from January.

In some programmes the admission procedure is run by the partner Universities Consortia.

The University offers specific services and detailed information for international students on how to choose, apply for and register in a degree programme.

Scholarships, aid and benefits

The University of Bologna offers to all its students scholarships, fellowships, and a wide range of aids and benefits on the basis of specific competitions.

International students can apply for a study grant worth 11.000 € gross (assigned on the basis of the SAT and GRE tests) or an exemption from tuition fees (Unibo Action 1 and Unibo Action 2).

The Regional Authority for the Right of Education ER.GO helps students through study grants, exemptions from tuition fees, residential and meal services, funding and aid for disabled students according to set requirements based on income and merit.

The Collegio Superiore of the University offers to highly talented students free lodging, an annual grant and the exemption from university fees.

Once students are enrolled they can apply for several other opportunities such as prizes, paid students collaboration, specific financial aids.

International mobility

The University of Bologna promotes international exchange and offers to enrolled students several mobility opportunities for study and traineeship abroad through various programmes: Erasmus+ Study for study mobility, Erasmus+ Placement for traineeship mobility, Overseas and Erasmus Mundus for non-European mobility. Students can also get funding from the Schools for the purpose of preparing abroad the final dissertation.

International students can take a study period at the University of Bologna as exchange students within the above mentioned programmes or thanks to other international agreements.

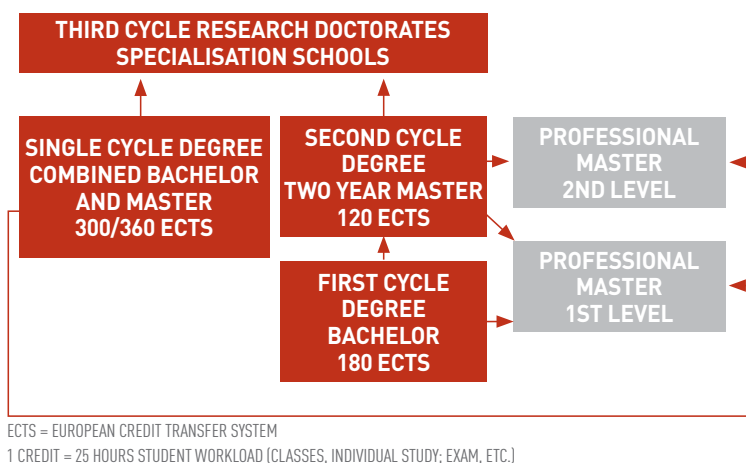

Italian University System

European credits based on student workload

All classes and courses carry a number of European Credits (ECTS). Each credit corresponds to 25 hours of student workload (including attending classes, individual study and project work, examination time). In the University of Bologna (and in all other European universities using the ECTS), the workload of a full year of study corresponds to 60 credits. One semester of full-time study corresponds to 30 credits.

Grading system

The Italian grading system has a minimum pass mark of 18 out of 30 and the top mark is 30 e lode (cum laude). The final mark range goes from 66 to 110 e lode (cum laude).

Academic calendar

The teaching and learning activities are scheduled in two semesters: September through December and February through May. Two exams sessions are scheduled at the end of lectures for every topic, and 1 make-up session is scheduled in September. The University has a 3-week Christmas break and a one-week Easter break; in August the University basically shuts down in terms of lectures and examinations, but the administrative offices remain open, except for a week over 15th August (bank holiday in Italy).

PhD and Third Cycle

The University of Bologna, as a research University, offers more than 40 PhD programmes with a strong International dimension and with a number of them offered in partnership with International Research Networks and leading to joint, double and multiple degree. Among third cycle programmes the University runs specialization schools in the following areas: Medicine, Cultural Heritage, Psychology, Veterinary Medicine, Health and Law.
